TO TRY INDIAN ON MIIDDED CHADCE MURDER CHARGE

Villagers Anxious That Necessary 1,500,000 Marks Cost Will Not be Met-Choosing Characters for the 1922 Production.

Oberammergau, Bavaria, June 27—
(Associated Press, by Mail)—Thirty performances of the Passion Play have been scheduled for 1922 by the committee of 21 which is directing the spectacle, but this number will be increased if the attendance demands, as was the case both in 1900 and 1910.

It will require an outlay of 1,500,000 marks to stage the Oberammergau play and the villagers are extremely anxious about the German political situation, lest conditions be such that foreigners will not attend.

The 360 burghers, who constitute the descendants of the original peasants who made the vow to produce, the play decennially, personally assume the responsibility for this expenditure, and the failure to attract sufficient visitors to meet the cost would result in the bankruptcy of practically the entire village, as the Oberammergau folk have slight resources.
