BORDEN'S SPEECH MAKES IMPRESSION

Delay in Making Peace While Soldiers Anxious for Home

SOME OTHERS HOLD SAME VIEW

M. Pichon Says Time Has Not Been Wasted in Paris and There are Various Obstacles to Immediate Peace

Paris, Feb. 17.—(By the Associated Press) Premier Borden's speech here on Saturday night in which he criticized the delay in consummating peace while the troops are anxious to return to their homes has made an undoubted impression here. The same view is said to be taken by some Americans, while the British are not indifferent to the demands of their territorial contingents, which are supported by the labor element of England.

S. Pichon, in discussing obstacles to an immediate peace during a talk with newspaper correspondents yesterday, said there were many reasons why the treaty could not be signed at once, even though the league of nations project was out of the way. Many issues that would form the basis of peace, he said, were being carefully studied. Among them was the disposition of many of the fragments into which the former Austrian empire had been divided, and another was the treatment to be accorded Bulgaria.

The French people, he added, wanted peace, but they realized at the same time the danger of precipitate and hasty solutions. He agreed with Premier Borden that there should be no unnecessary delay, but did not share his opinion that time had been wasted at the conference. A full discussion of all questions must be permitted so that settlements which might be decided upon would be unimpaired. Mr. Pichon said that there was no obstacle to recognition being extended the new German government, but added that the Germans must be made to realize they
