PITTSBURGHERS IN ROWBOATS WHEN SWOLLEN RIVERS FLOOD THE STREETS



Pittsburgh, Jan. 15—Heavy rains that finished the melting of the snow in the mountains that led to the unusually warm weather caused a flood in this city. Much of the lower portion of the town was under water, and residents of the houses took refuge on the upper floors. Boats were used for transportation of milk and groceries being thus delivered to the marooned citizens. In other streets the water was not so deep as to interfere with automobiles and horse drawn vehicles. There was considerable damage done to property, but no loss of life.

ENGLISH MONEY FOR NEW BRUNSWICK FARM LANDS. Particulars of a deal considerable proportions in farming lands in the St. John River Valley section of the province are to become public in a few days. The investors are said to be members of the party of English capitalists who visited New Brunswick with the London Financial News party under the direction of W. Leonard Palmer last summer, and whose trip up the St. John river was the result of action taken by the provincial government and the Agricultural Board of the Dominion.

Extenuating the Brown Tail Gleaner—That the brown tail moth is gradually being exterminated in New Brunswick is evident from the fact that during this season's campaign in Charlotte county only 81 nests have been discovered, as compared with 208 secured in the same territory last year. J. D. Tottill, of Ottawa, who had charge of the survey in the city, and is arranging to continue the campaign at the following places, where the pest was found to be in abundance last year: Harvey Station, Ormoco and Fredericton Junction.
