THE COMMON COUNCIL

Water Street Tracks—Wharfage Rates—Tenders For Coal

On the recommendation of Commissioner Schofield it was decided by the common council yesterday afternoon that plans be prepared by the city engineer for the laying of two tracks on Water street by the I. C. R., these plans to be approved by the common council. The right of the city to have the track removed any time at a month's notice was specified in the resolution.

Commissioner McLellan, who voted against the resolution, said that in his opinion only a few merchants would be benefited by the tracks.

Reduction of wharfage rates for the benefit of local merchants was the chief topic for discussion at the city council meeting yesterday and a resolution to equalize rates was finally carried. Awarding of tenders for coal was also put through yesterday. The full council was present.

The commissioner of harbors, ferries and public lands recommended that until further ordered full cargoes of merchandise intended for manufacturing purposes consigned to local merchants during the summer months be subjected to winter rates or through rates for top wharfage, namely fifteen cents per ton.

The resolution of Commissioner Schofield was also recommended the cancellation of the sale of the fee simple in lot No. 225 in Brooks ward to John Lee, the title of the latter be refunded his deposit after paying the city's costs. The recommendation carried.

He further recommended that the following tenders for coal be accepted: George Dick, 45 tons American A coal at \$7.25 per ton. C. E. Colwell, 30 tons American A coal at \$7.65 per ton (west side).

The acceptance of further coal tenders was recommended by the commissioner of public safety and adopted, as follows:

Fire department—City Fuel Company, 75 tons American A egg at \$7.25 per ton. R. P. & W. F. Starr, Ltd., 108 tons R. of M. (Sydney or Reserve), at \$4.50 per ton.
