

MORE ILLITERATES

IN NEW BRUNSWICK

THAN ANY PROVINCE

(Montreal Star.)

Ottawa, Dec. 9—The illiteracy of Canadian pecple, native born and immigrants, is an interesting feature of the census statics recently published in more detailed form.

Of the whole population, including immigrants, New Brunswick leads in illiterates with 14.5 per thousand of population; Saskatchewan comes second with 18.70, Manitoba third with 18.31, and Alberta fourth with 12.72.

The other provinces follow in this order: Quebec, 12.66; British Columbia, 11.61; Nova Scotia, 10.34; Prince Edward Island, 7.61; while Ontario with the best showing of all, has 6.51 per thousand.

Montreal has 40,000 illiterates or 9.71 per cent; Toronto has 31-2 per cent. illiterate: Ottawa, 6.26 per cent.; Winnipeg 9.98 per cent; Vancouver 6.11 per cent, and London 2.64.


