

Havana, April 15-The increase in trade between the United States and Cuba from \$196,000,000 in 1913 to \$445,-000,000 last year will be emphasized in an exhibit of Cuban trade at the annual session of the National Foreign Trade Council of the United States at Cincinnati, April 18-20. The great development of trade between the United States and Cuba has given the island a leading resistive in this respect amount the national states. and Cuoa has given the island a leading position in this respect among the nations of the western hemisphere. Cuba's trade with the United States is declared to exceed by large margins that of Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Mexico.
