Thompson, M.A. The Synod, having ascertained that Circular Letters had been duly issued, intimating the intention of these Presbyteries to make said application, instructed these Students to appear before the Examining Committee.

OVERTURE ANENT MEMBERS OF SYNOD COMMUNICATING TOGETHER AT THE LORD'S TABLE.

There was produced and read an Overture from the Presbytery of Glengary, craving the Synod to appoint it as a standing usage that all the members thereof shall, on the Sabbath following the opening of the annual meeting of this Court, together partake of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, on the grounds that a joint participation in this ordinance would be a becoming act of homage to the Great King and Head of the Church—would tend to promote Christian forbearance and brotherly love in conducting the deliberations of the Court—would be a blessed privilege to those who would thus meet around the table of the Lord—and would prove a source of comfort and refreshment to them after returning to their respective spheres of labour.

Dr. Urquhart, Mr. Croil, and other members of the Presbytery of Glengary were heard in support of the Overture. After due deliberation it was, on motion to that effect, unanimously resolved to defer further consideration of the matter until the next meeting of Synod, and in the meantime allow the Overture to lie on the table.

MANAGERS OF WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The Synod then proceeded to the election of three Managers of the Ministers' Widows' and Orphans' Fund; when it was unanimously agreed to re-elect the Rev. William Simpson and Joseph M. Ross, Esq., and to elect William Darling, Esq., to fill the place in the Board formerly occupied by the late John Greenshields, Esq.

The Synod adjourned to meet in this place to-morrow morning at a quarter before eleven o'clock, of which public intimation was made, and this Diet was closed with prayer.
