38 That the expediency of procuring an Act of Incorporation to comprise the whole of our Connexional funds, be re-

ferred to the Annual Committee for its serious consideration.

39 That the minister appointed to the Durham Circuit be

instructed by this Conference to visit the colored Church in Priceville, and ascertain immediately after Conference the

facts in reference to the propriety of establishing a Mission there, and promptly report to the Annual Committee.

40 That the name of the Blanshard Circuit be changed, and that it be hereafter called the St. Mary's Circuit.

41 That this Conference authorize the Arthur Circuit to dispose of an acre and a half of its church property, to defray the expenses of building a parsonage in Mount Forest,

42 That the proposal from the representatives of the Morris and Grey Circuit, to empower the Trustees of Connexional lots in Ainleyville to sell part of their property, be

referred to the Chapel Committee.
