A Kentucky apiarian, J. S. Reese by name, had in practical use the past season a device for getting bees out of finished or full cases of honey while on the hive without the use of smoke, etc. The plan also works well when applied to a pile-less or more—of full cases, when the lees can escape and not return. Mr. Reese believes his plan to be a new one, but modestly declines to apply for a patent, and describes it in detail for the benefit of others, with plain illustrations, in Gleanings in Bee Culture.



Illustration, the T super. Cut a thin board that will just fit inside the T case; bore two one inch holes, one near each end. In a few hours you may expect to have your full super all clean of bees and not a cell uncapped. 


