Free Trade. Says Bryan, Will

Aid in Crushing Trusts.

WHICH IS PARAMOUNT ISSUE

Questions of the Day Discussed by the

Probable Democratic Candidate For

the Presidency of the United States

—Brings a Message After World

Tour That Cause of Peace Is

Progressing Rapidly.

New York, Aug. 31.—Mr. Bryan's entry

into New York yesterday afternoon

was a series of ovations, beginning with

his landing at the Battery at 4 o'clock

and reaching an early climax when he

arrived at the Victoria Hotel, 27th

street and Broadway, an hour and fif-

teen minutes later.

Here the home-coming Nebraskan

fairly was mobbed by the thousands

who had forced their way into the cor-

ridors. Finally an entrance was effect-

ed by the police and Bryan reached

the lobby stairs. He was halted and

called upon for a speech, and then the

crowd surged about him, cheering lust-

ily all the while.

At Madison Square Garden, Mr. Bry-

an was given a grand ovation. He then

delivered a speech which is expected

upon which the coming Presidential

campaign will be fought. I think it is

safe to say that at present the para-

mount issue in the minds of a large

majority of the people is the tariff issue.

I congratulate President Roosevelt upon

the steps which he has taken to enforce

anti-trust law, and my gratification

is not lessened by the fact that he has

followed the Democratic rather than

the Republican platform in every ad-

vance he has made.

"We need no quarrel over remedies.

We must show ourselves willing to sup-

port any remedy which promises sub-

stantial advantage to the people in

their warfare against monopoly.

Free Trade the Weapon.

"The tariff question is very closely

allied to the trust question, and the

reduction of the tariff furnishes an easy

means of limiting the extortion which

the trusts practice.

"While absolute free trade would not

necessarily make a trust impossible,

it is probable that very few trusts

facturing establishments would dare to

enter into a trust if the President were

empowered to put upon the free list

the goods which they now import.

"Our nation has lost prestige rather

than gained it by our experiment in

"Absolute equality of treatment at

the hands of the railroad would go

far toward crippling a trust."

Public Ownership.

"An increasing number of all parties

see in public ownership the sure

remedy for discriminations between

persons and places and for the extor-

tionate rates for the carrying of freight

and passengers."

"I prefer to see only the trunk lines

operated by the Federal Government,

and the local lines by the several State

Governments."

An Elongated Peroration.

"Plutocracy is abhorrent to a repub-

lic. It is more despotic than monarchy,

more heartless than aristocracy, more

selfish than bureaucracy."

"It preys upon the nation in time of

peace and conspires against it in the

hour of its calamity. Conscienceless,

compassionless and devoid of wisdom,

it enervates its votaries, while it im-

poverishes its victims. It is already

sapping the strength of the nation,

vulgarizing the life and making a

mockery of morals. The time is ripe

for its overthrow. Let us attack it

boldly, making our appeal to the

awakened conscience of the nation in

the name of the country-people, which

it has defiled, in the name of business

which it has sullied, in the name of

the people, whom it has oppressed,

in the name of the homes

which it has despoiled, and in the name

of religion, upon which it has placed

the stigma of hypocrisy."

IMPERIAL UKASE.

Premier of Russia Wants Free Hand

and No Reactionary Policy.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 31.—An imperial

ukase issued yesterday declares martial

law, where it has already been enforced,

for another year.

It is asserted that Premier Stolypin

is said to have told friends that he is

continually subjected to embarrass-

ment, and that he was convinced that

his task was impossible unless the Em-

peror gave him an absolutely free hand.

In other words, conferred upon the

Cabinet a practical dicta-ship.

In his conversation with friends the

Premier is alleged to have said that

reactionary spirit was growing rapidly.

Nevertheless he considered it vital that

the Government should not take a re-

actionary path.

NO TAX EXEMPTIONS

Wanted By Members of On-

tario Municipal Union.

GO ON RECORD ON THIS POINT

Privilege Has Been Abused and the

Legislature Will Be Asked to Abolish

ed—What the Motions Passed

Toronto, Aug. 31.—The convention of

the Ontario Municipal Union concluded

its business yesterday with a luncheon.

President-elect Ellis of Ottawa pre-

sided at the closing business session,

the feature of which was the adoption

of a resolution that legislation be

sought to do away with all tax exemp-

tions by municipalities. A number of

the delegates expressed the opinion

that while such a measure was going on

the time amongst municipalities to se-

cure industries and to this end many

ways are found to grant exemptions.

Some religious organizations and

educational institutions get exemption

on properties from which they derive

good rent, and it was hardly hoped

that the Legislature would make one

straight cleaning of the exemption

statute, but with a view toward secur-

ing such legislation eventually the res-
