There has, at no time, been serious opposition in any of the northern counties to the general policy of the Blair Government. The stamptage question, however, has been a subject of contention between the Government and our people since October, 1885. Although this paper supports the Government then, as it always has done, it raised a strong protest against the high rates of stamptage in its issue of 1st October that year and warned the Government of the consequences of adhering to its policy in that matter.
