







ST. PETERSBURG, April 28-Count Witte, speaking on the budget at a meeting of the council of the empire today, said that the Jewish disabilities meeting of the council of the mappic today, said that the Jewish disabilities caused a powerful body of Jewish fi-nanciers abroad to boycott Russian se-curities while Russia's recent allena-tion of German financiers had led to a further contraction in the market dealing in the securities. The Russian debt had risen to \$5,900,000,000, an in-crease of \$1,460,000,000 in five years. M. Kekovscieff, minister of finance, in reply, paid his respects to Count Witte's authority in matters of finance, but said that the future should not be painted so black. He called attention to the current rise in the Russian mar-ket, imperial Russian fours being now 22 points higher than in 1906, when Witte was in power. The maintenance of peace and prudence, he said, was a strong factor in prosperity.



LONDON, April 28-Wilbur and Or-ville Wright will be the guests in Lon-don, May 3, of the Aeronautical Soci-ety of Great Britain. They will, on a; ety of Great Britain. They will, on this occasion be presented with the so-viety's gold medal, which will be inscribed: "Presented to Wilbur and Orville Wright in recognition of their distinguished service to aeronautical science." The obverse side of the medal will bear an illustration of a flying eagle and a balloon.
This is the first time the gold medal of the society has been presented since the establishment of the organization and in 1866.
