MAINE NOTES OF THE WORLD

GRIN EXPORT SEASON AT PORTLAND, ME., CLOSES.

Ship Dirigo Safe—Damage to Vessels—Recent Charters—Dangers to Navigation—Steamer Floated.

SHIP DIRIGO SAFE.

The ship Dirigo of Bath, for which her crew had been feared for her safety, owing to one of her life buoys having washed ashore on the coast of Maryland, arrived below Baltimore yesterday with all hands well.

DRIFTED ASHORE.

Beaufort, N. C., June 11.—Ferry-boat Maryland drifted ashore several days ago on sandy bottom. The Columbia parted hawser twice in an attempt to float her. Will pull on her again next high water.

STEAMER FLOATED.

Philadelphia, June 11.—Stmr Harry Luckenbach, hence for Galveston, previously reported aground off Washington Park, and subsequently floated, lightened about 800 tons of coal; she is anchored off Gloucester, reloading cargo; vessel apparently undamaged.

SCHOONER LEAKING BADLY.

Vineyard Haven, Mass., June 11.—Schr Francis M. Jacksonville for Bath which was floated off Cross Rip Shoal last Sunday by revenue cutter Acushnet, arrived here yesterday leaking badly, with 8 feet of water in her hold and with steam pump disabled. New pump will be procured and vessel's bottom examined by diver before proceeding.

New York, June 11.—Stmr Pica (Ger), reports May 20, lat 48 11, lon 46 32, saw two growlers; and lat 48 50, lon 43 28, an iceberg.

CRUISER FLOATED.

Quebec, June 12.—The CPR tug Cruiser has been floated on the reef at St Catherine's Bay and is now being towed up the river by the wrecking steamer Strathcona. The tug's engine room is full of water. She will be docked at the Lewis Graving dock for repairs.
