HISTORIC DAYS IN CANADA

#### TRACY'S EXPEDITION.

as an unofased authority of matters of naval defence, it says:

The Prime Minister (Mr. Borden) desires to associate Canada intimately with the Mother Country in trade, council, and defence, and is anxious to shape Canadian policy so that it may fit in with imperial policy and lead to a further consolidation of the Empire. This is not Sir Wilfrid Laurier's policy; he desires to establish a naval service in Canada distinct from that of Great Britain, it is to be built, equipped, manned, and controlled by the Canadian Government, and is to be, moreover, as separate from the Navy of Great Britain as the fleets of France or Russia. In time of war it is to assume neutrality unless after careful examination, debate, and consideration the Government considers the quarrel in which the United Kingdom and the Empire are involved to be just, and forthwith passes an Order in Council permitting the ships of the Dominion to take part. In other words, Canada, according to Sir Willfrid Laurier's conception, is to remain within the Empire and hold in leash whatever naval forces she may possess. A fleet conceived on these lines merits Mr. Borden's description of a "neutrality navy."
