New York, May 11—Purchase of the Lackawanna Steel Company of Lackawanna Steel Company of Lackawanna, New York, by the Bethlehem Steel Corporation involving the use of Bethlehem seven per cent preferred and class B. common stocks in payment for the properties was announced late today by Sugene G. Grace, president of the Bethlehem organisation. News of the merger, which became known just before the stock market closed gave Wall Street a real thrill. Lackawanna Steel made a net gain of seven points, closing at 65%. There were 73 sales, totaling 17,100 shares in the last hour, the largest sale of 1,400 shares being disposed at 61,400 shares being disposed at 61,400 shares were 23,500 shares. There was less activity in Bethlehem Steel, which closed at 79, the top price and a not gain of 1% points. Of the day's trading of 11,000 shares, 4,100 were disposed of in the final hour. Shares of the Republic Iron and Steel Company, the only stocks in addition to the Lockawanna which were included in the proposed merger of seven independent steel companies and traded in only by the big board, showed substantial gains, Republic showing a net gain of three points and Midwale of 14%.
