

MARKET REPORTS.

Satisfaction is expressed at the fall mill prices. The lumber market at Montreal shows good payments on the fourth of the month, and the lumber trade at Quebec but business on the whole is good. The circular saw and art mill is well employed.

Cold weather has stimulated trade in lumber at Hamilton. Lumber is fair at Toronto, trade is brisk and prices are firm. The lumber trade at Victoria, and collections improving.

ENGLISH TIMBER MARKET.

Deals from New Brunswick Steady, Advancing in Prices, and Further Increase is Expected.

London, Nov. 2.—The Timber Trade Journal says:—

So far as the general position of the trade is concerned, the market is steady on record. Free-on-board business, on which sales are, is not so brisk as it was some time ago. The specifications to which it would fit in with the requirements of the market, and which wholly conformed to small parcels to make up quantities of immediate shipment, are not so much in change in current price. There are no indications of a general rise in prices, and we understand shippers are counting on much larger demand for small parcels than has been done in this direction on the basis of the Swedish fourth of the month, but this has no significance in regard to the English market.

The chief interest, at the moment, centers round the question of the price of the most speculative buying has, we hear, been done lately, and possibly during the month of the year, desirable stuff. The consumption
