Dr. Kenealy, "I should have thought my Lord Chief Justice would have heard of the proverb. I am quite as incapable of inventing anything of the kind as his lordship is." A few days afterward Dr. Kenealy was able to score a victory over the Judge on this subject. He quoted Junius and John Huss, the latter of whom said, "Once offend a priest, and cut his throat; for he will never forgive you." The counsel added that there was a German saying which has become proverbial, "Priests and wemen never forgive." Lord Chief Justice, "Well, I leave the priest to defend themselves; but it is hard upon the women. [Laughter.] It is surely not intended that if you offend a woman you must necessarily cut her throat." Dr. Kenealy added that there was smother German proverb, "Offend one monk, and the lappets of all cowls will futter as far as Rome." Whereon the Lord Chief Justice was fain to admit that more authority had been shown for the statement than he had thought possible.


