LONDON, Jan. 26. It is considered that the Duke de Broglie, by the part he took in Friday's debate in the French Assembly, has cleared up all the chances of forming a new administration, as the vote on the motion to close the debate, which was made and supported by his partisans, proved there was a majority of nearly 200 against him.

The Montenegro difficulty has been compromised. The citizens of Montenegro who are implicated in the Podgorica massacre are to be tried at Cattigue. The evidence of the Turkish witnesses in the case will be taken at the frontier town of Spah.

An autograph letter from Alfonso was delivered to Queen Victoria on Saturday formally advising her of his accession to the throne, and assuring her of his intention to rule over Spain on constitutional principles; a similar notification was received by Franco.

New York, Jan. 25. Gold 112 1/2. Exchange 487 & 490. January 27—no latitude or longitude—was spoken by Mr. J. Harrington of Liverpool, N. S., from St. John, N. B., for Liverpool, with foreman, libeom and maintenance gone, bearing up for Bermuda.

The Navy Department building at Washington was damaged by fire to-day. Loss unascertained. It is considered probable the Canadian Finance Minister will reimpose ten per cent duty on tea and coffee imported into Canada from the United States.

(Special Telegrams to the Tribune.) The Fredericton City Hall a Heap of Ruins—The Falling of the Walls—The New Steam Fire Engine Tests.

FREDERICTON, Jan. 26. Last evening about 7:30 the City Hall was discovered to be on fire. The alarm was immediately given, but some time elapsed before the engines were on the ground. The Sibley engine, purchased early in the winter, was taken to the river, but, for some cause or other, proved wholly inefficient. As the other steam engines were being repaired there were only two hand engines to do battle with the flames. Within two hours the building was completely gutted. Then down came the walls with a crash, shaking the surrounding buildings to their very foundations.

The building cost \$25,000. It was insured for eight thousand dollars in the Imperial. It is not known how the fire originated.

LONDON, Jan. 26. A TERRIFIC GALE, accompanied by rain, prevailed on the British Coast to-day. Innumerable casualties to sailing craft are reported. JOHN BRIGHT addressed his constituents at Birmingham Monday night. His speech is mainly against the connection of Church and State in England.

A FRENCH SENATE bill for the creation of a Senate passed the French Assembly yesterday, 512 to 418.

DIPLOMATIC. Layard, the British Minister to Madrid, will be recalled on account of his Republican sympathies.

THE CARLISTS AND ALFONSOISTS in Spain held a party on the 22nd and agreed on a basis for a convention, which will probably be ratified on both sides.

FRANCIS DEAK, the Hungarian statesman, is hopelessly ill. THE FERVENT BELIEVERS were repulsed on the 21st inst., before Arcquipa, with heavy loss.

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. LORD DUFFERIN, who is rumored at Montreal that Lord Dufferin will resign as Governor General and be appointed Viceroy of India.

SEVEN HOUSES at The Terrace, Montreal, were burned yesterday—loss \$20,000. There was a conflagration at Jacques Hay, Dec. 27, in which 300 houses were destroyed—loss \$800,000.

BOYCHURVILL, QUE., Jan. 26. SIX PERSONS CRIMATED. A fire yesterday morning destroyed the farm house occupied by Pierre Dubois, and his wife and 8 children perished in the flames. Dubois was seriously burned in his efforts to save his family, and is not expected to recover.

(Special to Daily News.) OTTAWA, Jan. 25. At a conflagration in Boecherville, near Montreal, last night, nine persons were burned to death.

\$20,000 fire also took place in Delle Valley, leaving twenty-two families homeless.

McLaren and Tremblais are preparing to have a rate issued against the Prohibitory for not sending papers up to Court of Appeals in the Montreal West contested election case. They have been kept back on the ground of irregularities in procedure.

The Liberal, Hon. Edward Blake's new organ, is to be published on Wednesday in Toronto.

One of the servant maids in sleeping out a drawing room in Bennett's Hotel, Georgetown, on Saturday morning, found the dead body of a male infant under a sofa.

It now turns out that the Governor General's proclamation commuting Lepine's sentence was dated 19th January, but was not published until the 20th, one day after the local elections in Ontario, and then in an extra of the Gazette.

FREDERICTON, Jan. 25. The City Hall, built of brick, and which cost twenty-five thousand dollars, was destroyed by fire this evening. The building was partially insured. The fire is said to have originated in the keeper's room.

CARLETON, Jan. 25. The Hon. Robert Young, who reached his home in safety after a toilsome journey, got information on Sunday that the rioters intended calling on him to-day. He accordingly made preparations to receive them in case they should come.

This morning at 9 o'clock, a mob commenced to assemble near Rives'. At 10 o'clock, about 3 hundred men, armed with guns and sticks, moved forward to Young's house. He had taken the precaution to lock and barricade the doors. The rioters discovered that he had a few men inside who, were well

armed. Some of the gang knocked at one of the doors, but did not attempt to break in. After half an hour spent in consultation outside, the mob withdrew, saying they would return in the evening. There were no evidences of disquiet at 5 p. m.
