RULES & REGULATIONS,

Approved by order of His Excellency the Governor General and Commander-in-Chief, March 10, 1860.

In consequence of the alteration in the Militia Act, reducing the Volunteer Rifle Companies to thirty men each, we, Number six Company of Montreal, unanimously agree to keep our Company to its present strength of eighty two men, according to the following Rules and Regulations, subject to the Governor General's approval.

RULE I.

GOVERNMENT OF THE COMPANY.

- SEC. 1. The Company in all matters relating to its organization, discipline and duty, shall be governed according to the Militia Law of the Province, and by such orders as may be issued by the commander-in-Chief, from time to time.
- SEC. 2. The private business and internal arrangements of the Company, shall be conducted according to the following Rules of order:—
 - 1. Minutes of former meeting read.
 - 2. Members to be proposed.
 - 3. Reports of Committees.
 - Public business connected with the prosperity of the Company discussed.
