He enlisted with the 231st Battalion in Vancouver in
July, 1916, proceeding overseas in April, 1917. In May he
crossed to France to join the 72nd Battalion, with which
unit he served until September 9, 1918, when he was
wounded. He was admitted to No. 32 Stationary Hospital,
and died of wounds there October 11, 1918.
