Oranges or Lemons may be imported into the British Colonies of America, from the Azores or the Madeiras.

and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act any Oranges or Lemons, the Produce of the Azores or the Madeiras, may be shipped and laden there for Exportation direct to any of the Ports of the British Colonies in North America, and may be imported into the said Ports in any Britishbuilt Ship or Vessel owned, registered, and navigated according to Law; any Law, Custom, or Usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
