Sir:

On March 15th there is a serious probability that the Canadian Association of University Teachers will impose censureship upon the University of New Brunswick. The likely effect of such censureship will be a deterioration of the quality of education offered here.

We the Student Representative Council of the University feel that it is not in the best interests of higher education in the nation or the province for such censureship to be

imposed.

We feel that neither the principle of administrative autonomy nor the principle of academic freedom, both in themselves important principles, are as important as the principle of the best possible education for the students here.

We are not taking sides in this confrontation nor threatening action of any kind. We sincerely hope that a rational, objective and democratic approach by the students here will achieve some favourable response. To demonstrate the unity of the student body on this point, a petition is being circulated which it is expected the majority of

students will sign.

A copy of this petition is being forwarded to Prime Minister Trudeau, Opposition Leader Stanfield, Lt. Governor Bird, Premier L. J. Robichaud, Opposition Leader Hatfield, Hon. W. W. Meldrum, Minister of Education, Sir Max Aitken, Chancellor of the University, Dr. Colin B. MacKay, President of the University, Dr. C. B. McPherson, President of the CAUT, and to individual members of the Board of Governors.

We would appreciate any assistance in bringing the two

parties to arbitration.
