I have just had forwarded to me from Ottawa the telegram which you addressed to me on the 26th. It arrived this morning.

I am managing a group of Companies here in Toronto and am not in Ottawa at all except the short time the Somate is sitting the early part of the year. I certainly cannot see any way in which I could be of help to you now. The Canadian authorities would never interfere with the process of the Courts in the United States. All anyone from another country is entitled to there is the regular trial, the same as a citizen of their own country. I am indeed sorry that you are in trouble.
