
Sir,-

Mr. A. E. Dymont has requested the Department to send you a copy of Order in Council passed about the year 1884, regulating the size of timber to be cut on Indian lands to nine inches only, and in compliance therewith I inclose a copy of same dated 9th August, 1884, which it is assumed is what you desire.

The Order in Council of 12th November, 1877, provided that all pine trees of larger growth than 12 inches in diameter at the butt were to be reserved from sale to settlers.

The Regulations made by Order in Council of 1877 and 1884 were superceded by the Consolidated Regulations of 1888, a copy of which is inclosed herewith.
