I have the honour to transmit herewith a copy of a letter of the 26th ult. from Acting Indian Agent Wright asking for authority to hold elections of chiefe an headmen at the next Treaty Fayments in the Couchiching agency.

You will observe that Mr. Wright is in some doubt as to the Department's decision that elections canno properly be controted in Manitoba, the elective system not having been applied to that province so that any so called "clections" can only be regarded as appointments; also as to the term of office being "indefinite."

I should be gled to be advised by you wheth you consider that there are any reasons why the appointment of chiefe and headmen in the Couchishing agency should be conducted in a different manner from that of chiefe and headmen in other agencies in Manitoba; also your views as to Mr. Wright's recommendation in regard to the reduction of the number of headmen in certain bands named in his letter.
