



Sir : -

I have the honour to request that you will be good enough to cause the Commission issued in favour of Solomon Angus in January, 1898, to be cancelled for the following reasons: During the Lachine liquor cases last spring it appears Angus was drinking with Indians, thus bringing his office into contempt, and the Department has also learned that he was the Dominion Constable who on July 20th, at Haileybury, where Iroquois returning from the Quinze engaged in a drunken spree, showed his constable's badge in Ferland's hotel and stated that the Indians with him might be supplied with liquor in moderation.
