Rev. Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 1st instant giving the dimensions of the dormitories at the Kitamat School as requested in official letter or June 16th, last, in which you were informed that the Despartment would be prepared to pay a grant to this school for thirty pupils instead of twenty provided the accommodation was adequate.

In reply I beg to say that the measurements of the dormitories given in your letter show that they only contain 11.32 cubic feet, which is only suggicient air space for tway public. The trace areas also see all the ment of forty-five pupils, which is more than double the mumber for mich accommodation is provided in the present dormitories, and unless more dormitory space is furnished no more than twenty pupils can be allowed to remain in the achools If your church wishes to avail itself of the Department's offer to pay for thirty pupils it will have to partment's offer to pay for thirty pupils it will have to provide adequate dormitory space for ten more pupils. Five hundred cubic feet of air space in the dormitories give hundred cubic feet of air space in the dormitories is required for each pupil under the new arrangement and is required for each pupil under the new arrangement and the Department must see that this rule is complied with.
