With further reference to your letter of Nov. 2, 1911, No. 1996435, I beg to enclose herewith a copy of the plan of survey of the two plots of land on Sturgeon May, Lake Winnipeg, at the mouth of the Dauphin River required for certain members of the Little Saskatchewan Band who are in that locality. In the event of either of these blocks interfering with block one of Timber Berth 1166 mentioned in your said letter it is desired that the land be set spart as an Indian Reserve with that portion which may be included in the said Timber Berth subject to the rights of the same. The Indians will be informed accordingly . If possible it would be very satisfactory if a limit of a number of years could be given to the lessee of the Timber Berth

and that after the expiration of the said limit he will cease to have any rights within the limits of the Indian Reservation.
