

- (2) Decidedly weak policy in connection with strikes compared to actions in other Democratic countries.
- (3) No explanation of the cost of living index - Ottawa crams down our throats that the cost of living has not gone up, when any housewife knows hers has. Decidedly no educational job has been done here to justify Ottawa's insistence that cost of living is not rising steadily.
- (4) Public have been very poorly informed on all restrictions. The reason why being clear to the main Trustees but not to the man in the street.
- (5) The billion to Britain. Here again no clear explanation of how and why this was done.
- (6) Extremely weak internal information activities on the Canadian participation in the war. The Hush Hush policy has resulted in Canadians having a confused picture of what we are doing in the war.
- (7) Extremely good publicity stories of Canada in other countries, which if obtained could be re-released in Canada, showing Canadians our actions are appreciated abroad.
- (8) Benefits to Canada have not been sufficiently voiced from the air training plan.
- (9) Canada's position in future world air traffic not exploited sufficiently.
- (10) No policy as to post-war - leaves country jittery as to future.
- (11) No definite platform to bally-hoo or flag wave about. Consequently no avid enthusiasm on Liberals part as compared to C.C.F. who feel they are fighting for a worthy cause.
- (12) No apparent attempt to interest young Canadians in the Liberal Party.
- (13) No guarantee of jobs to armed services.
- (14) No definite decision for or against Marsh and Beveridge plans.
- (15) Insufficient allowances for Income Tax deductions for married men especially with children.
