Following my letter of the 6th of February  
to you, will you please supply a report advising -

- (a) If the Tidewater operation was stopped.
- (b) If dues were collected on timber removed.
- (c) If the Band is willing to surrender the timber  
for sale by the Department for their benefit.

It is expected that we will shortly be able  
to arrange for a forestry engineer from the Forest Branch to  
go to British Columbia, and in that case we would ask him to  
discuss this matter with you with a view to determining a plan  
for the cutting and conservation of timber on this Reserve.
