There are in this county alone 12,000 acres belonging to the Canada Company. Land within two and half miles of our residence they have refused to set a price on. We see by some of the papers that they have already reduced the price \$4 per acre from what they have been asking. This we suppose is due to the agitation that Mr. Glas has caused. We require the lands in this country to be unlocked to us.
