The Persons Entitled to have the Voters' Lists Revised.

Every voter and every person entitled to be a voter in the municipality for which the voters' list is made, or in the Constituency, i. e., County or Riding as the case may be, in which the municipality is situate, may have the voters' list for the municipality revised and corrected. (R. S. O. chap. 9, sec. 8.)

Revision of Voters' List.

On receiving the voters' list, the 1st and 3rd parts should be examined to ascertain: *First*. Whether the Christian and surnames of those persons favourably inclined, and of those who are doubtful, are correctly entered and spelled; this should be attended to carefully, other-
