GUNBY's motion in regard to the Annual Conference Missionary Committees, which was unanimously adopted by the Conference, was as follows: "That said Committees shall consist of ministers and laymen in equal numbers, the lay members to be appointed by the laymen of each Annual District Meeting."

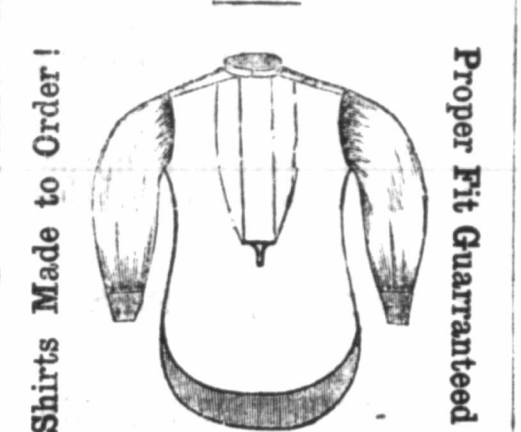
