

AN ORDER OF SERVICE

FOR PRIMARY CLASSES OR THE HOME LESSON

Fourth Quarter, 1911

I. RESPONSIVE SENTENCES :

Teacher. What was Jesus' custom on the Sabbath day ?*Class.* "As His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day."

II. SINGING. Hymn 573, Book of Praise.

III. PRAYER. All recite with bowed head and folded hands :

Father of all, in heaven above,
 We thank Thee for Thy love ;
 Our food, our homes, and all we wear,
 Tell of Thy loving care.

(Let the children remain standing while the teacher leads further in prayer.)

IV. SUPPLEMENTAL LESSON. Learn and repeat Scripture Memory Passage. For those under six, The Good Shepherd, Ps. 23. For those under eleven, The Ten Commandments, Ex. 20 : 1-17. (A pretty Certificate in colors is awarded for the correct recitation of all the verses in the List of Passages For Those Under Six ; and a larger Certificate for the correct recitation of the complete List of Passages For Those Under Eleven.)

V. SINGING. Hymn 535, Book of Praise, v. 3. (This is the last verse of the Supplemental Hymn for the Half Year. The verse should be learned by heart. As the little ones sing it Sunday after Sunday, they will soon come to know it by heart.)

We'll bring the little duties	And better are these treasures
We have to do each day ;	To offer to our King
We'll try our best to please Him,	Than richest gifts without them,
At home, at school, at play :	Yet these a child may bring.

VI. OFFERING. Make the children familiar with the Bible story of the widow's two mites. Let the teacher recite during the offering :

Jesus sat beside the treasury,
 Saw the love gifts as they came,
 Knew the hearts that loved to bring them
 For the sake of His dear name.
