The Rev. L. H. Dean, pastor of the Congregational Church at North Brookfield, Mass., has signified his intention of entering the ministry and will prepare for ordination at Detroit.

At St. James's Church, Handsworth, near Birmingham, on Sunday morning, the handsomely carved oak choir stalls, the gift of the family of the late Rev. John Sheldon and Mrs. Ann Sheldon, were dedicated. The former was Vicar of St. James's from 1856 until 1882, and during his incumbency the church, which, on his arrival in the parish was in a very bad condition, was entirely renovated. In addition a new side chapel was built, a new organ provided, and a vicarage and a new boys' school built.

A well-known bishop relates that while on a recent visit to the South he was in a small country town, where, owing to the scarcity of good servants, most of the ladies preferred to do their own work. He was awakened quite early by the tones of a soprano voice singing a well-known hymn. As the bishop lay in bed he meditated upon the piety which his hostess must possess which enabled her to go about her task early in the morning singing the noble strains. At breakfast he spoke to her about it and told her how pleased he was. "Oh, law," she replied; "that's the hymn I boil the eggs by; three for soft and five for hard."—Adelaide Church Guardian.

During the past few months several handsome memorial gifts have been presented to Grace Church, Columbus, Nebraska, which included a brass lectern, given by Mrs. C. D. Evans. At his annual visitation, which is to be held shortly, the Bishop has promised to dedicate an artistic rood screen, given by the bishops, clergy, relatives and friends, in memory of the late Mrs. Westcott, the wife of the rector, who died just about a year ago.

A memorial window of unusual beauty has been placed in All Saints' Church, Atlanta, Ga., to the memory of the late Elizabeth King Pate. The window is Gothic in form, and its subject is "The Annunciation to the Virgin," as described in St. Luke 1. It is the first of a series of windows which will be placed in this church in sequence to illustrate scenes in the life of Christ and His Ministry in pictorial and symbolic form. It is also intended that these pictures shall present when complete in number, a comprehensive narrative of the gospels.

The most curious almshouse in England is St. Mary's Hospital at Chichester. There eight old ladies actually live in the church, which is a fine old building dating from 1580. It was originally a monastery but Queen Elizabeth turned it into an almshouse to endure as long as almshouses exist. The old ladies have two rooms each down the sides of the main church with windows looking out on the garden. At a chapel daily services are held. The choir stalls are beautifully carved old oak, the original seats that the monks used.

The Dean of Edinburgh and Mrs. Wilson were publicly presented on the 5th April, their silver wedding day, with a beautiful and chaste silver casket, containing a cheque and an accompanying book containing the names of some five hundred friends who had united in making this gift. Sir Alexander Chisholm presided, and Mr. J. R. Anderson made the presentation on behalf of the donors. The Dean has been associated with the cathedral for the last eighteen years, and for nearly seven years past has occupied his present position.
