CAP. XX.

An ACT to amend an Act for regulating the Exportation of Butter. Passed the 5th of March, 1805.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the restriction in the Act for regulating the Exportation of Butter, that the "fame should be packed in Firkins of hard season—"ed wood," has been found inconvenient, for remedy whereof—

Butter may be packed in feafoned Wood of any kind, except Pine and Cedar. I. Be it enacted by the PRESIDENT, Council and Assembly, That all Butter hereafter to be shipped for Exportation, may be packed in any Firkins of seafoned Wood other than Pine or Cedar, so as the same be free of sap, tight and well hooped.

Recited Act to remain in force, except as hereby altered. II. And be it further enacted, That the faid in part recited Act and every clause thereof, except wherein the same is hereby altered, shall continue and be in full force, any thing to the contrary herein contained notwithstanding.

CAP. XXI.

An ACT to APPROPRIATE the Public Revenue. Passed the 5th of March, 1805.

Sums to be paid out of the Treafury: BE it enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this Province, unto the several perfons hereaster mentioned, to wit:—

Members of the Assembly. To the Members of the House of Assembly, for defraying their Expences of travelling and actual attendance, reckoning Twenty miles to each day's travel, to be certified by the Speaker, the sum of Ten Shillings per diem.
