Rebellion Claims licenses to local purposes; applying such portion thereof as may belong to localities in *Upper Canada*, to the payment of the said claims until the same be fully paid.

Ordered, That the Honourable Mr. Papinean have leave to bring in a Bill, to provide for the payment of Claims arising out of the Rebellion and Invasion in Upper Canada, and to appropriate the Duties on Tavern licenses to local purposes.

He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received and read for the first time, and ordered to be read a second time on Tuesday next.

Winter Roads.
