Mr. Cardwell to Lord Monck.

DOWNING STREET, 30th June, 1866.

(Copy, No. 72.) My LORD,-I have received your Despatch, No. 51, of the 11th instant, in which you enclose copies of two Acts passed by the Legislature of Canada, authorizing respectively the summary imprisonment of persons charged with certain offences against the peace of the Colony, and the trial, in *Lower Canada*, by a Military General Court Martial, of persons levying war against Her Majesty in that Province.

I rely on your discretion for the use you will make of these extensive powers, and do not doubt that you will have recourse, in every case in which it may be possible to do so, to the ordinary tribunals for the punishment of offenders.
