**ST. JOHN, N. B. AUTUMN CARNIVAL.**

One feature worthy of comment in connection with the Carnival to be held at St. John, from the 8th to the 14th October, is the extremely sportsmanlike manner with which the Halifax men have co-operated with St. John in enabling the arrangement of the finest Boat races probably ever held in the Maritime Provinces. These races will undoubtedly revive the most brilliant events of bygone times of which our older men still speak.

The two best Halifax men will put up a splendid scull race with the local St. John amateur champion, Jas. Ross, son of Elijah Ross, of Paracrow fame. Heffler and Patterson will contest in the double scull event; Heffler, Coates, Patterson and Prender in the Amateur Four, and Warner, Dugan and two others not yet named, in the Professional Four, comprising the best aggregation of Oar-men which ever left Halifax.

The races will be rowed off on Monday, 13th October, at 10 a. m., on the harbor of St. John. A very large crowd is assured from all parts of the Province and the State of Maine, the facilities arranged for cheap travel being very favorable. Foot Racing has always been extremely popular in these Provinces, and many lovers of sport will look forward with great anticipation to the Foot Racing to be held in connection with the Autumn Carnival at St. John, N. B., from 8th to 14th October. The Editor of the Sporting Times, Boston, now holds the purses necessary to bring up the best sprinters in America. Such men as Piper Donovan, Keene and Hobbs will display their powers, while the leading amateurs throughout the provinces are entering with enthusiasm the contests provided for them.

Altogether the number and importance of the attraction arranged for during each day of the Carnival week, is beyond precedent in the city's experience.

**New Use for Refined Paraffine Wax**  
A new and important use for Refined Paraffine Wax seems to have been discovered by a prominent resident of Ohio, living near Lancaster, who had two trees badly damaged by storm, one being a maple and the other an apple. In each case a large limb was broken down from the trunk, but still attached to it. The limbs were propped up and fastened securely with straps, very much as a broken leg might be fastened with splints and then melted refined wax poured into and over all the cracks. The "surgical operation" was entirely successful. The Paraffine prevented the escape of the sap, kept out the rain and moisture which would have rotted the trees, prevented the depredations of insects, and the limbs seem thus far to be perfectly re-attached to the trees.
