They are Roman Catholics and the ceremony was performed by a Roman Catholic priest in a presence of one witness. The potitioner now said that the marriage was null and void by recson of the fact that only one witness was present and that the ceremony was not carried out according to the rites, regulations, and ceremonics of the Roman Catholic Church or according to law. The respondent denied that the marriage was null and void for any of the reasons stated by the petitioner.


