### ANDREW CONNORS

Services were conducted at the house by Rev. Mr. McLean.

### PROPOSES TO BRING UNKNOWN'S BODY

The body of an unknown Canadian soldier is to be brought from the old western battlefield and buried beneath the Victory tower of the new parliament buildings.

"It is proposed," says an official statement issued by the prime minister's office, "that the body of Canada's unknown soldier should be interred at the base of the main entrance to the House of Parliament within the confines of the Tower of Victory at peace. At the entrance of the tower is a symbolical representation of the struggle between civilization and barbarism. The dominant figures upon the tower are warriors with arms reversed. In sculptured stone upon the walls and in the niches is written the romance of history embracing the beginning of the nation.

"The memorial chamber forms the first floor of the tower above the archway, is entered from the main floor of the central hall, the proportions, arches and columns of which will attune the visitor's mind to the dedicated place where he will presently stand over the sacred dust beneath it."

### Montenegrin Refugees

#### Have Caused Much Trouble

#### To Queen Helen of Italy

Although Queen Helen of Italy is a daughter of the late King of Montenegro and despite the fact that the former sovereign dynasty of Petrovich and its followers, have been a terribly heavy tax upon the generosity of the Italian crown and Government, yet the Montenegrin refugees in Italy, and especially at Rome, including the former Cabinet Ministers, Popovitch, Antonievitch and Plamenatz, have been behaving so badly that the Police Department in the Eternal City has been obliged to make a descent upon the pseudo Montenegrin Legation and Consulate-General, also upon the residences of the three former Ministers, and to seize all the documents and papers there, with a view to criminal prosecution.

The charges brought against these Montenegrin refugees, who, as in France and elsewhere, have behaved with characteristic ingratitude and complete disregard of the obligations of hospitality, include those of conspiracy with the Socialist forces which are seeking to upset the Italian Government and dynasty and likewise of gross fraud and dishonesty in connection with the funds set aside for the relief of the two or three thousand Montenegrins who have sought refuge in the dominions of King Victor Emmanuel.

A sum of some seven million dollars is involved, and naturally there is much bitterness, both in the national legislature at Rome and in the Italian press, over the idea of this money being accorded to worthless

and dishonest Montenegrin refugee dignitaries to enable them to live in luxury, instead of being employed in affording relief to the widows and orphans of soldiers who had fallen fighting for their country in the great war.

It must be thoroughly understood that the pretensions of these more or less questionable hangers on and parasites of the late former King Nicholas to still represent an independent Montenegrin Government are without the slightest foundation. It must not be thought that Queen Helen has encouraged them. The Queen of Italy is a diplomatic woman, and realizes that no good can come from such plots. Still the fact remains that her former countrymen have placed her in a very embarrassing position.

Nicholas and his precious sons behaved so badly in the great war, abandoning their country to its fate, under the most suspicious circumstances, that long before the former king's death his fellow-countrymen had renounced their allegiance, and made clear their determination never to permit him to return to their Black Mountain. The Montenegrins, wise in their generation, voted to join the Jugo-Slav Confederation, under the sceptre of the late King Peter of Serbia. Nicholas denounced him as a usurper.

But Peter's death changed the situation. For he is succeeded as monarch of the Jugo-Slav Confederation by his second son, King Alexander, who, with a splendid war record behind him, can hardly be looked upon as an alien ruler by any Montenegrin, since he is a grandson of Nicholas, and may therefore be considered as one of his immediate heirs. King Alexander's mother, now long since dead, was a Montenegrin princess, and the eldest sister of Queen Helen of Italy.

If King Alexander is now ruling over the Montenegrins, it is by virtue of their well nigh unanimous votes, recorded in the form of a plebiscite; and that they are satisfied with their lot, and that things are working smoothly there, is demonstrated by the fact that most of the officials of the civil and military administration of the Montenegrin portion of the Jugo-Slav Confederation under the sceptre of King Alexander are Montenegrins by birth.
