Giant Squid the Explanation. The animal, however, which unloubtedly forms the basis of most o these records is the Giant Squid. In early days the existence of these creatures was unknown, and Pernetty, describing a voyage made in 1763-4, is apparently the first to mention these gigantic cuttle-fish. The Danish naturalist Steenstrup in 1847 described a Squid with a body twenty one feet long and tentacles eighteen feet in length. In 1861, the French steamer Alecton encountered a Squid with a body from sixteen to eighteen feet long near Teneriffe, and the crew succeeded in roping it, but the rope cut through the body near the ninder end and only the tail was secured. 
