St. John's Municipal Council. PUBLIC NOTICE.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of Section 256 of the St. John's Municipal Act 1921, the Council is empowered to fix the rate of taxation to be paid by all persons or companies owning, operating or keeping for hire or profit any theatrical, musical, dancing, pictorial, pantomime athletic, circus or other kind of public performance, exhibition or amusement within the city limits and to vary the rate as between local and foreign companies.

BE IT RESOLVED by the St. John's Municipal Council in regular Session convened this 4th day of January, A.D., 1923 that the rate of taxation to be paid by such persons or companies aforesaid shall in the case of local persons or companies be two per cent. of the gross amount received at such performance, exhibition or amusement, and in the case of foreign companies be three and a half per cent. of the gross amount received at such performance, exhibition or amusement.
