

CALGARY, July 6.-Crop conditions based upon reports of the United Grain Growers were given out today by E. J. Fream, newly-appointed commissioner of the South-ern Alberta drought relief act, and which were said to be the most op-timistic reports yet issued on the crops thus far this season.

STATES WHEAT **BOARD NECESSARY**

CALGARY, July 6 .- Only through the establishment of a compulsory wheat board, preferably one operated by the three western provinces, coule the farmers ever hope to get a fair price for their grain, was the opin-ion expressed by H. W. Wood of the United Farmers of Alberta, in an address on the wheat board given before the members of the board of trade today.

"The price of wheat will never be stabilized unless such a board is es-tablished. Under the present system we are unable to control the flow of wheat to the market, and consequently we cannot hope to con-tro! the price," he said.
