DEATH OF MR. F. C. MINTY
It was only the other day that Mr. F. C. G. Minty, Manager of the local branch of the Bank of Commerce, was called upon to sustain a double bereavement in the death of his wife and child, and now his father also has passed away. The Globe has the following reference:—
Mr. Francis Chas. Minty, who was at work as usual at his place in the Bank of Commerce on Tuesday, died on Wednesday of neuralgia of the heart at his home, 377 Manning avenue.
