ASKS GOVERNMENT TO REFUND MONEY

P. E. Island Looks To Ottawa For Justice For Settlers Who Were Swindled.

Charlottetown.-Debate on the draft address in the legislature opened Thursday. The opposition leader, A. Saunders, scored the government for its failure to redeem pre-election promises and in "its wholesale dismissals of officials" particularly former soldiers, also for deciding to close the agricultural school. Stewart, in replying, said that the withdrawal of federal grants necessitates the government taking up none out essential expenditures and anounced that there would be an inuiry into the educational system by sub-committee of the government. He said that an attempt would be made to bring Hebridean settlers to the Island this Summer. Referring o the Andrew Fraser Mitchell dealngs with Anglo-Indian settlers the Premier said that the government had applied to the federal department of mmigration to refund money taken illegally from the settlers.

The address was moved by J. A. MacDonald and seconded by F. Mac-Donald. It was noted that in a house of thirty members there are five "Mac-Donalds".

ANOTHER ANNUAL REPORT TABLED

In presenting the annual report o the Superintendent of Neglected and Delinquent Children in the , Local House, Attorney General O'Hearn re marked upon the good work which had been accomplished during the vear by the juvenile courts. It was regrettable, he declared that there were not more of these courts in Nova Scotia. He mentioned also the resignation of Judge Patterson from this service and spoke in high terms of the work he had done, expressing the opinion that Judge Crockett who takes his place will follow in the ootsteps of Judge Patterson.

The report embodies the activities of the various childrens' aid societies of the Province and other organizaions engaged in the care of children In the report of the judge of the Juvenile Court, Halifax, it is pointed out that while the number of cases tried during the year is larger than last year, it is not as large as some previous years. There were before the court 181 offenders.

There were during the year 120 children delivered into the care of societies and the Superintendent of Neglected Children. During the same period, 113 children were placed in foster homes, and 40 were returned to parents or guardians.-Herald.
