"Epiglottis.—Numerous tubercle bacilli, singly and in small clumps, numerous pneumococci, some staphylococci.

"Sputum.—Numerous tubercle bacilli, a few cocci, and short bacilli." Sir Felix Semon traces the case from a primary pneumococcus stage, through the period where a secondary tubercular infection gained a foothold in the larynx, to the terminal condition where the pharynx showed "enormous improvement," but a terminal pulmonary affection marched steadily forwards.

He feels justified in presenting the fullest details "to assist further observers, and to enable them to build up a clinical picture of the disease."
