Already we learn that enough has been collected to support two orphans, and that money for that of a third has been promised. We trust to hear of many other schools in the Lower Provinces doing something in the cause of missions. We have pleasure in stating that in place of Beebee deceased "Bebé De Suga, 12 years of age, an active lively child" has been assigned to St. Andrew's Church Sabbath School, Montreal, and her two sisters to the Schools at Niagara and Brockville. Johanna has been assigned to the latter. "She is 14 years of age, is good-tempered and obliging, and learns very well." These children are at the Bombay Orphanage, all these at Calcutta having been already appropriated.



A MISSIONARY HOUSE.

The above picture represents the house of a missionary in West Africa. The houses there are usually built of wood and stone. He lives, as we would say, "up stairs," for he never occupies the ground-floor of his house, but uses that as a cellar or store place, which is built of stone. The upper part, where he
