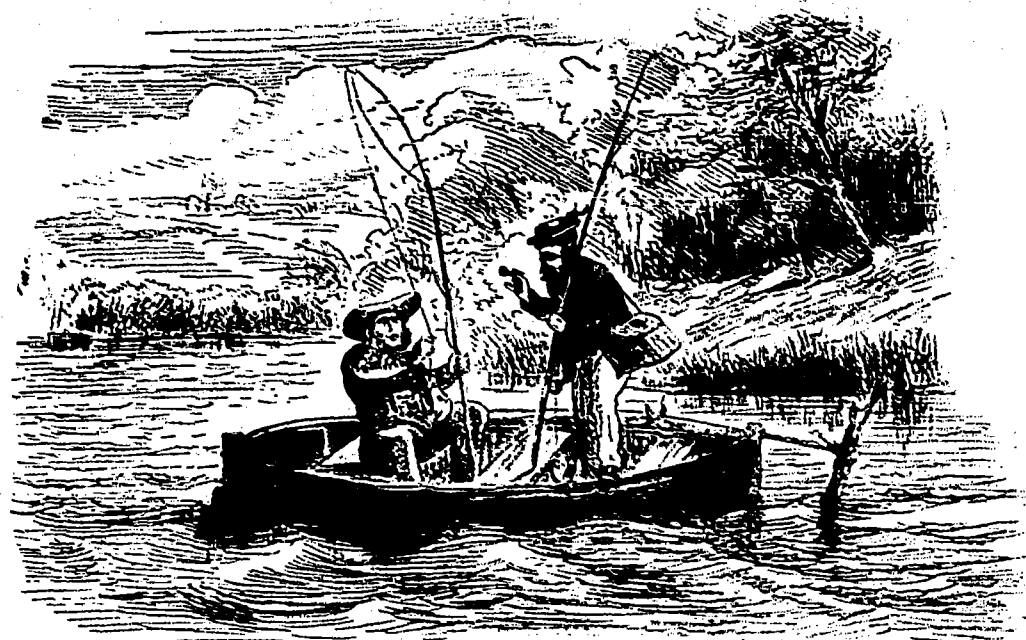


A FISHING ADVENTURE.

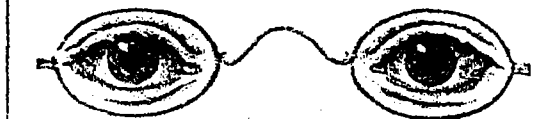
