

On motion of Sir *Leonard Tilley*, The House went into Committee of the Whole, to consider a certain proposed Resolution, respecting the manufacture of Beet Root Sugar in Canada.

(In the Committee.)

The following Resolution was adopted :—

Resolved, That in order to encourage the introduction of the Manufacture of Beet Root Sugar in Canada, this House declares that such industry should be exempted from the payment of Excise Duties, for eight years from the first of July, 1881.

Resolution to be reported.

The said Resolution was accordingly reported, and read the first time.

Sir *Leonard Tilley* moved, that the Resolution be now read a second time.

Mr. *Colby* moved in amendment thereto, that the Resolution be referred back to a Committee of the Whole, with instruction that they have power to add a Clause, to provide for the admission free of duty until the first day of September next, of such parts of machinery to be used in the manufacture of Beet Root Sugar, as are not manufactured in this Country; which was negatived on the following division :—
